## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPTER DIRECTOR

Stories are paramount to who we are. They offer a glimpse of the past; they influence the decisions we make in the present; they set precedence for who we can become in the future—at times, in the most astonishing way imagineable!

For pflag in Peel Region, we began exploring coming out stories with families in the 1970s when Parents of Gays was created by Anne Rutledge and June Tattle-Gosse. Years of dedicated story-telling led to a pflag dedicated to serving those in Peel Region: pflag Brampton (1986) and pflag Mississauga (2004). In 2016, pflag Peel Region was formed by Vijay and Sushma Agarwal, focusing on supporting the South Asian Community. In 2017, the chapter was reinvented as pflag Mississauga by two passionate volunteers who focused support for the Transgender Community. And in 2024, the chapter was renamed as pflag Peel Region.

Change and development happens in all stories. Evidently, we are no exception in our transformation as a chapter—and as storytellers in the coming out journey for ourselves and/or for others!

## CHAPTER SERVICES & FOCUSES

We offer multiple services, including peer-to-peer support, community workshops, and 2SLGBTQIA+ resources. Additionally, this chapter and its dedicated volunteers outreach and table at various community events. The chapter is also focused on critical partnerships and promoting volunteering opportunities.

## RESOURCES

We have curated a library of public, community resources focused on 2SLGBTQIA+ support for the Peel Community! Currently, we have 17 categories of resources, which include services and programs found across Peel Region, and digital and physical pieces of literature and entertainment-based media. At pflag Peel Region, we have accumulated a total of 107 pieces of resources altogether!

## SUPPORT

We are proud of the peer-to-peer support sessions that are provided for the community. In our newly formed monthy sessions, called After-Hours, we facilitated 3 online sessions; had a total of 24 unique registrants; and engaged a total of 17 new and recurring participants looking for essential 2SLGBTQIA+ and allyship support and guidance!

## MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS

We recognize the importance of a digital footprint: To connect with the broader Peel 2SLGBTQIA+ Community. The chapter understands that communicating through various online channels is key!

Thus, our volunteers in marketing and communications are hard at work redeveloping the chapter's website to create a welcoming, informative, supportive, and accessible user experience. Furthermore, we're hoping to expand to two additional media platforms. These are exciting developments that will allow us to stay connected with an impactful presence!

## **EDUCATION**

We are excited to present the Rainbow Basics Workshop: A workshop delivered to community organizations, for-profit corporations, and educational institutions. The workshop focuses on Foundational (2SLGBTQIA+) Terminologies, the Coming Out Process, and Practising Allyship—all centered around storytelling!

Furthermore, the chapter's educational outreach goes beyond the workshop and into Peel Region at community events. So far, we have outreached and tabled at 2 events, and engaged 80 community members!

## **VOLUNTEERISM**

We proudly support volunteerism as an opportunity to explore talent, passion, and skills through a nurturing learning environment and through an internal volunteer hub—called VolOpportune Resources—created just for our volunteers to access learning and healthcare resources. Since September 2024, we have onboarded a total of 14 volunteers in various interdisciplinary roles!

## **PARTNERSHIPS**

At the chapter, partnerships that align with the organization's values for community, inclusivity, growth, and accountability are essential to the behind-the-scenes work being done to deliver the quality services we offer to the Peel 2SLGBTQIA+ Community.

This year, our partnerships included those with Brampton Library in the promotion of a social 2SLGBTQIA+ community space focused on boardgames and video gaming—Rainbow Road Game Night. Another partnership included that with Queen Square Doctors and Family Health Team in supplementarily providing professional mental health-based services for youth participants in After-Hours.

Additionally, we are involved in the Countering Hate Committee's Youth Subcommittee, which is led by Peel Regional Police and Safe City Mississauga; and the Peel Regional Police Chief's Resource Council's LGBQT2S Community Council, led by Peel Regional Police. These committees are essential in keeping our chapter informed of critical 2SLGBTQIA+ community resources through information exchange and informed resource development.

Lastly, Erin Mills United Church has agreed to liaise with us in generously lending their space for a book-lending initiative. In this collaboration, we are hoping to lend the broader Peel (2SLGBTQIA+) Community books that provide 2SLGBTQIA+ support in various capacities and intersectional perspectives!


Meadowvale Community Church is an affirming community who believes there is a circle of life, a Great Dance of Love shared by the Father, Son and Spirit in which we are all included!


## HERIVERWOOD CONSERVANCY
